Direct to feeder rates were firm to dearer across the board as most contributors lifted rates by up to 10c/kg. A tightening of supply following the recent rain has been a main factor behind the dearer trend. Assisting feeders going forward is the amount of feed grain expected to be available.

Physical market feeder purchases were also dearer, however the light yearlings went against the trend. The increased prices was also due to feeders looking to maintain supplies.
