Paddock feeder rates were cheaper for most categories, with short fed steers showing the biggest change. Northern feedlots are reporting that very few cattle are being placed, as moving cattle in Queensland remains difficult with transport routes closed. Export demand for grain fed beef is sluggish and the high A\$ is affecting trading.

Physical market prices were generally higher, with the tighter supplies lifting competition.
