#### Lauchie Cole, Tasmanian Farmers' and Graziers' Association



Lauchie is involved in the management team at the Woodbourn Murray Grey and Angus Stud in Cressy, Northern Tasmania. Lauchie joined the operation in 2007 and is involved in all aspects of the business. Woodbourn runs 220 Angus and 150 pure bred Murray Greys with bulls sold throughout Australia. Woodbourn also runs prime lambs and an intensive cropping program under irrigation.

Lauchie has travelled extensively throughout Australia working on a variety of farming enterprises before completing an Advanced Diploma of Farm Management at Marcus Oldham College, Geelong, Vic. Injemira has also been the number one supplier of live heifers and bulls to the developing Russian market. Semen & embryo sales have seen Injemira genetics exported to most parts of the world.

Marc sits on the Pfizer Animal Health Genetics Advisory Board & is a Board Director of Herefords Australia Ltd. In 2011, Marc was also named 'The NSW Young Farmer of the Year'
