The following report on the Longreach Prime and Store Cattle sale for March 14, 2012, was provided by Simstock Rural Agencies

Due to clear weather the Longreach Prime & Store sale attracted a yarding of 4400.

Buyer attendance was strong with good competition across the board as buyers filled quotas.

A much larger yarding of vealers were penned compared to previous weeks with the majority of the yarding being made up by cows. Good yearling steers were up while all other sectors dropped consistent with the trend from other markets this week.

Good quality, heavy young local Brahman bullocks rang to the bell once again at 183c/Kg. Heavy feeder steers were in large numbers easing to average 176c, topping at 185.2c/Kg.

The best medium weight steers reached 184c slightly dearer on last week with plainer lines hovering around the average.

Although a large yarding of cows were presented the quality was lacking with the lighter cows making from 109c to 134c. Heavier cows reached 165c averaging 145c/Kg.
