Paddock feeder rates realised a weaker trend, after several contributors adjusted rates as supplies increase. However, some producers are reportedly baulking at the lower rates. Cattle suitable to the domestic trade market remain in tight supplies due to the better seasonal conditions resulting in heavier, better covered cattle.

Saleyard prices showed a consistent decline, although demand for heavy cattle was firm.
