Entrants are encouraged to attach an electronic photo or to supply a short 'home made' video clip of the innovation.

Selection Criteria

As a guide, we are looking for innovations that relate to feed manufacturing, feed delivery, cattle processing or cattle handling, yard maintenance, occupational health and safety. The Innovation should be about:

- Labour saving and/or
- Delivering improved accuracy/efficiency and/or safety in the day to day operation of the feedlot
- Materials for the creation of the Innovation should cost no more than \$3000

All finalists will receive a complimentary registration to BeefWorks and they (or a representative from the feedlot) will be asked to present a 3-5 minute powerpoint (or video clip) that demonstrates the effectiveness of the Innovation.

The winning Innovation will be selected by popular vote'as judged by BeefWorks delegates and announced at 2pm on Thursday, Septemberr 24, at the culmination of BeefWorks Day 2. A cash prize of \$500 will be made available to the winner and \$250 to the runner up.


