Grain fed cattle numbers remain high

Cattle numbers in Australian feedlots remained at near record levels, falling less than 1% for the June 2015 quarter to 956,927 head.

Australian Lot Feeders' Association (ALFA) President, Don Mackay, stated that "the result reflected the ongoing dry conditions in particularly Queensland (which made it difficult for grass fed cattle operators to sustain numbers) as well as continued strong demand for Australian beef overseas."

"Small declines were experienced in every feedlot state except Queensland and Victoria whilst nationwide feedlot capacity utilisation, at 82%, remained extremely high."

"Strong international demand, as well as some rain across the eastern states, saw feeder and grain fed cattle prices record robust growth during the June quarter."

"Saleyard feeder steer (330-400kg lwt, C2) prices averaged 262¢ during the quarter (up 37% year-on-year), while the eastern states domestic paddock feeder steer indicator (280-350kg lwt) averaged 255¢ over the three months (up 31% year-on-year)."

"Darling Downs grain trended cheaper year-on-year but was dearer than the previous quarter. Barley averaged \$318/tonne during the quarter, back 8% year-on-year, sorghum averaged \$302/tonne, back 4%, while wheat averaged \$325/tonne, back 11%."

"Meat & Livestock Australia's Operations Manager, National Livestock Reporting Service, Damon Holmes, stated that 2014/15 grain fed beef exports were up 15% (to 250,954 tonnes swt) compared to the previous financial year."

"Japan (up 24% to 143,686 tonnes swt) continued to be the dominant export market for grain fed beef for 2014/15 with 57% of exports directed there."

"The second largest grain fed beef export market was South Korea (up 11% to 37,454 tonnes swt) followed by the EU (up 13% to 16,545 tonnes swt), the US (up by 133% to 13,688 tonnes swt) and China (down by 40% to 13,122 tonnes swt).

"Shipments of grain fed beef during the June quarter were the highest on record, with almost 66,000 tonnes swt exported over the three months, up 23% year-on-year and above the 2006 peak of just over 61,000 tonnes swt."

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
