As the successful candidate, you must have significant knowledge and experience in the beef and/or sheep meat industries and an understanding of each industry's RD&A needs and challenges. You will lead an experienced and passionate team of Regional Committee Chairs utilising your executive level skills in managing and facilitating meetings, networking, negotiating and mentoring peers and other stakeholders.

This challenging role will also require active participation in a number of consultative committees and a commitment to attend periodic meetings involving SALRC core business across the SALRC regions.

The expected time commitment is 60-80 days per annum, plus travel. An honorarium will be paid.
