Who is involved in the Proposal?

Valinda Team Pty Ltd is the company involved in both overseeing and laying the foundations for the Pickanjinie- Beef Abattoir processing project. 3. Inland Tourism. There is more to see in Queensland than only beachside holiday destinations, such as the Gold Coast. Inland Queensland has a lot to offer overseas tourists, including wide open spaces, fresh clean air, friendly people, abundant wildlife, and much more. Simply put, there are some things we take for granted in the bush, that can be a lifetime memory for someone from another country.

Our Abattoir will be built in memory and respect to the Pioneers of this great region.
