It is recommended all Rangers to undertake the full NT Police training and induction course.

### INCREASE MVR SERVICES

Provide inspections and on site motor vehicle registration and licensing services to cattle stations and Indigenous Communities as a single point of call.

Aim would be to register all road worthy vehicles and register as many people in regional and remote areas.

This releases the service currently undertaken by NT Police which would then be able to use their resources for enforcement and not regulation.



### REDUCE STOCK THEFT

Provide investigative and evidence gathering in the regions to support the NT Police.

All incidents of stock theft would be investigated in the first instance by the Rangers who would then hand any evidence and the investigation file over the NT Police to action.

### INCREASE STOCK INSPECTIONS

Provide inspections and on site animal welfare monitoring in regional and remote areas.

This could also cover animals involved in roadside or transit accidents for insurance reports that need to be assessed and authorised.

### INCREASE BIOSECURITY

Provide inspections and ensure biosecurity processes are in place when required and regulated.

The Rangers would assist NT Police with border restrictions, make sure wash down bays are being used correctly and any recommendations are being followed.

In the event of a biosecurity outbreak, the Rangers would be operationally ready to mobilise stakeholder engagement and implement confinement strategies.

### REVENUE

The Northern Territory Livestock Rangers could be funded through a mixture of sources including a "fee for service" in handling registrations and licensing on cattle stations and Indigenous communities.

Other revenue streams will include the supply of "in-kind support" including the provision of office space through some of the local government regional council communities and the land councils.

The NTCA would provide the overall administration, logistics and operational support to the Northern Territory Livestock Rangers delivering cost saving on current NT police, biosecurity resources and increase revenue and efficiencies for both MVR and MACC.
