More about Quinyambie

Quinyambie's 12,000 square kilometres of Pastoral Lease is rated at a maximum capacity of 11,000 head. Quinyambie terrain includes sandhill and swales in the north, and mostly open rangeland country in the south. The water system is extensively developed including capped artesian bores, dams, tanks and troughs. Road maintenance is a cornerstone of the successful Quinyambie cattle business covering vast distances. Trucking yards are strategically placed. Development is a priority.

Quinyambie currently has a minimum staff of four. At peak times a pool of MPC staff is shared with Mulyungarie, Mutooroo, and Lilydale. In-house or external pilots are employed. The company operates Cessna aircraft. Mustering includes helicopter and motorcycles.

The homestead and station yards are in Quinyambie's south-eastern corner, including the three family homes, school room, kitchen, quarters, sheds, hangar and airstrip. Dwellings have town power and aircon. Quinyambie homestead is about two hours by road from Broken Hill, and about eight hours to Adelaide via the station access road though Mulyungarie to the Barrier Highway.
